Low floor easy access buses are normally provided on our long distance services, Moorland Discovery routes, Scarborough and District 128, Yorkshire Coastliner 840 and Arriva 93.

ACCESS FOR ALL
Local fares are available for single journeys – please ask the driver.

Up to four children (ages 0-15 inc) may travel free with a fare paying adult.

Concessionary passes are accepted on all services except the Farndale Shuttle Bus, Heritage Bus and the Vintage Bus.

Tickets are for all-day travel on the Network. They are issued and accepted on Moorsbus, and by our partner services Scarborough & District 128, Yorkshire Coastliner 840 and Arriva 93 and 5 services on relevant days.

MOORSBUS TICKETS
You'll recognise a Moorsbus by the plum and yellow triangle displayed at the front of the bus. In towns and villages they use normal bus stops but in the countryside you can hail the bus – drivers will stop wherever it is safe to do so.

Moorsbus services run on Sundays and Bank Holidays from 28 March to 31 October, plus Wednesdays in July and September and daily from 26 July to 4 September. Partner services also operate daily from 5 July to 2 October.

Moorsbus is a network of bus services to and through the North York Moors which make it easy to explore the area without the need for a car. This helps keep the moors a special and more enjoyable place, now and for future generations.

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ROSEDALE RAMBLER

You cannot travel far in the North York Moors National Park before coming across signs of previous generations. At various stops on the Rosedale Rambler you can walk in the footsteps of early Christians and Roman soldiers and discover clues to the area's industrial past – hard to imagine given the peace and tranquillity that reign today.

This leaflet aims to give you an idea of just some of the great places Moorsbus can take you. It is not intended as a circular tour and you won't be able to visit them all in one day, but there is always tomorrow!

Park and Ride

Why not leave your car at one of our National Park car parks? Take the bus from Sutton Bank, The Moors Centre, Danby, Hutton-le-Hole, Thornton-le-Dale or Newton under Roseberry and get your all day parking fee of £2.20 (£1 after 4pm) refunded when you buy an all-day Moorsbus ticket. Use the special voucher with the car park ticket.

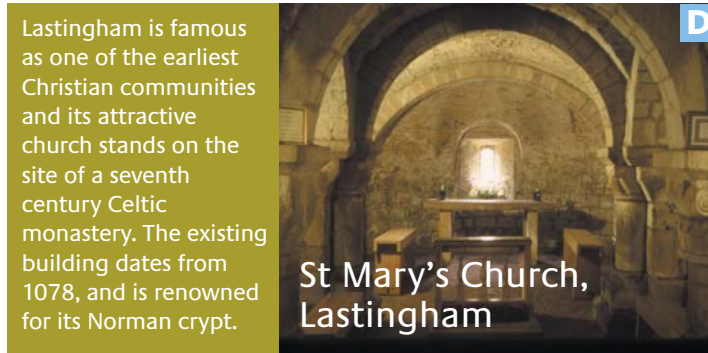
Pickering

Step back 200 years at Pickering's Beck Isle Museum. Housed in a Grade II* listed Regency Mansion, the museum has an eclectic collection of curios relating to the work, social life and customs of local rural communities. Pickering is also where you'll find the ruins of an early Norman motte and bailey castle and the start of the enchanting North Yorkshire Moors Railway.



Cropton Brewery

The pretty village of Cropton is home to the only working brewery in the North York Moors. Beer has been brewed in the village since 1613 and the current operation has been running since 1984. Call in at The New Inn to sample beers such as Old Goat, Pullman Pint and Scoresby Stout and to enquire about brewery tours.



St Mary's Church, Lastingham

Lastingham is famous as one of the earliest Christian communities and its attractive church stands on the site of a seventh century Celtic monastery. The existing building dates from 1078, and is renowned for its Norman crypt.



Rosedale Abbey

This picturesque dale is encircled by the remains of an old railway built to transport ironstone mined here, to the north east. Though mining stopped in the 1920s the remains of kilns used to purify the iron ore are still visible. Rosedale Abbey is also home to the remains of a Cistercian Priory and to Gillies Jones Glass, internationally renowned glassmakers who create elegant hand-crafted bowls. Their studio and exhibition area is open from March to November.



Cawthorn Camps

Cawthorn Camps is a group of three Roman military fortifications that were built and occupied at various times between AD90 and AD130. An easily accessible one-mile loop takes you on a tour around the defensive banks and ditches. Why not pick up a copy of the full-colour guide book for more information on life at Cawthorn? It costs £1.95 and is available from National Park Centres, Pickering Tourist Information Centre and the New Inn at Cropton. *Cawthorn Camps is a request stop between Cropton and Newton upon Rawcliffe on the Rosedale Rambler, tell the driver when you board the bus that you want to get off here.* Cawthorn Camps is a short walk from the road.



Ryedale Folk Museum

Jump off in the picturesque village of Hutton-le-Hole for Ryedale Folk Museum, a quirky slice of rural life. Set over three acres, the museum features a range of beautifully restored buildings through the ages from a crofter's cottage and 16th Century manor house to the intriguingly named Witches Hovel and Hearse House.



Rosedale Rambler Walk

Some of the best walking in the area can be found in the secluded valley of Rosedale. On a short two mile walk from Rosedale Abbey you can see up close the remains of the old ironstone industry that once dominated this now tranquil area and take in some wonderful views across moorland, woodland and farmland. *For this and other walks in the area, pick up a copy of the booklet Walks around Rosedale Abbey from the Abbey Stores & Tearoom in Rosedale Abbey or online at www.moors.uk.net/shop*
