CNP agrees that small scale tourism and recreation developments are more environmentally, socially and economically appropriate for the National Park. While not calling for an outright ban on off road vehicle use, CNP would like to see the NPA operate the precautionary principle in terms of new claims for routes and investigate the use of Traffic Regulation order in order to pre-empt damage to sensitive routes. There should be a strict criteria based policy for assessing applications for off road recreational driving facilities.

New caravan sites need to be considered carefully as part of a Park wide strategy for recreation, including an assessment of whether new capacity is needed.. 16. What forms of new tourist / recreational development do you think are needed in the National Park, and where should they be located? Are there some forms of recreational activity that should not take place in the National Park?

The forms of tourist and recreational development that are needed in the Park would be around sustainable tourism and tourism that extends the traditional season to all year round. The National Park already has a good example of this with the publication of their 'Horse Riders Guide to the North York Moors'. Other similar forms of tourism development, for example for bike riders, would be appropriate.

Other suitable development that could be encouraged would be that associated with the provision of 'specialist holidays'. Examples could include painting, photography, bird-watching, astronomy (much of the Park area has some of the lowest levels of light pollution in England), food holidays, adventure holidays (excluding motor sports) and conservation holidays (looking at local flora and fauna). All these activities can take place all year round. The LDF could also try and make connections between activity providers, accommodation providers and local food suppliers to help promote a complete 'North York Moors Experience'.

Off road motor sports such as 4x4 driving and trail motorbikes should be discouraged due to the physical damage they can do and the potential conflict with the statutory National Park purposes.

17. Do you think there is a need for more accommodation for visitors in the National Park?

Accommodation can take several forms, ranging from camp sites and camping barns at one of the scale to 5 star hotels or holiday villages at the other, and should not be considered as a single entity. The LDF needs to be clear what type of accommodation (if any) it wishes to encourage and where such accommodation would be appropriate. Small scale conversions of existing farm buildings to holiday accommodation could offer a good diversification opportunity for many farmers within the Park area.

18. The current local plan permits the development of small-scale caravan (and chalet) sites in areas of existing woodland? Do you think this is appropriate, or should new caravan sites in the National Park be resisted?

Small scale caravan and chalet sites in areas of existing woodland would be appropriate as they again offer another opportunity for diversification. This is subject to such development not having a detrimental impact on the wider landscape. Other sites which are well screened, either by way of natural geographical features or well designed landscape schemes, may also be appropriate?

National Parks are an important resource for sport, and provide the opportunity for millions of people to participate in their chosen activity. By far the greatest number of visits per year to National Parks are made by walkers, by the Parks are also an important specialist resource for sports such as climbing, caving and water sports. Emerging sports such as the extreme sports, are also likely to be undertaken in areas where the topography provides suitable landscape features required for the particular activity. The Park should not only seek to maintain and improve opportunities for outdoor sport along with good management practices to balance the needs of sport with other interests, but should also embrace the opportunity to develop new niche markets in the extreme sports. If provision is made for downhill mountain biking, for example, then issues of erosion etc can be contained to manageable levels.

The Park should always seek to diversify and develop new markets. The Park should not dismiss opportunities such as provision for athletes training for London 2012. Sustainable diversification should be seen as an opportunity.

We do not think that any new development is needed as we feel that the Park is approaching saturation levels, particularly in respect of traffic. Any new development should be located in market or coastal towns outside the Park. This should not preclude the up-grading of existing facilities - e.g. unsightly caravan sites replaced by landscaped chalets; hotels and restaurants upgraded; redundant farm buildings developed as camping barns or overnight stabling. Recreational activities which generate a lot of noise, or which damage the vegetation or paths, should be banned. This would include the recreational use of off-road 4 x 4s, motorbikes and quad bikes except perhaps in isolated areas where provision already exists, though derelict industrial land near conurbations is the location of choice. A limited number of controlled motor sport events should continue to be held

16. What forms of new tourist / recreational development do you think are needed in the National Park, and where should they be located? Are there some forms of recreational activity that should not take place in the National Park?

I was impressed by the way in which existing attractions [Sutton Bank especially] had been thoughtfully and sympathetically developed to provide a greater range of facilities for visitors, including information about other attractions and encouragement to use the readily available bus service. It was also good to see how local industry [Forestry Commission, Theakston and Thompson of Kilburn] had expanded their on site operations to provide tourist attractions in such a way as to minimise their impact on their immediate surroundings. The RAC Foundation sees no reason why all forms of recreational activity should not be encouraged, provided they are appropriate within the outdoor sporting and recreational context of the area and can take place alongside existing pursuits without detracting from them, or endangering those taking part. During the course of my stay, I walked some of the Cleveland Way, sharing the path effortlessly, even pleasurably, with horse riders, mountain bikers and vehicles accessing farms and fields adjoining the path. However recreational off road vehicles would almost certainly have diminished the pleasure of walkers and riders [horse and mountain bike] alike.

17. Do you think there is a need for more accommodation for visitors in the National Park?

The last two weeks in June is perhaps not the basis for a judgement on the adequacy of accommodation at the height of the season. However, I saw plenty of available accommodation of all types during my stay and have not previously found difficulty in getting accommodation. That said, a gradual increase in accommodation spread across the area would be beneficial.

The current local plan permitting the development of small scale caravan/chalet sites in areas of existing woodland seems to work very well, in fact I stayed at a very sympathetically laid out small chalet site at Felixkirk. Although most visitors to National Parks come to enjoy the natural environment, the weather can be a factor in excluding certain sections of society, especially some elderly and disabled people, economically disadvantaged people, especially those with young children and without transport, and people from urban ethnic minority communities. Therefore TVRCC supports the development of varied, affordable, all weather leisure facilities in selected areas. Such facilities in the larger towns mentioned in the LDF would also benefit local people, and would provide alternatives to public houses.

TVRCC also supports the further development of mineral rail lines as part of an integrated transport system for the benefit of both local people and tourists. Railways can be an all weather heritage attraction in themselves, as well as providing a sustainable transport infrastructure that would relieve pressure on the roads.

TVRCC believes that there is a need to ensure that National Parks remain as a benefit for the whole nation, including socially and economically excluded urban communities, who would gain greatest benefit from access to this resource. There is an urgent need to engage with such communities to explore ways in which they can access the National Parks. Issues of affordability need to be addressed.

The Scouting Movement has given many urban young people an abiding love of the countryside. There is a need to find alternatives that will meet the needs of a more diverse modern population.
