Beavers: Explore Activity Badge

These visits can achieve two out of the four requirements for this badge.

- Think about what you expect to find
- Go on the exploration

Leaders can book **either** a visit to the seashore **or** a visit to a woodland.
At the end of the session each Beaver is presented with a certificate of merit.



Seashore Visit

This takes place at either Robin Hoods Bay or Runswick Bay. Your National Park Leader will meet you on the slipway and take your group down onto the beach to explore the rock pools, finding and identifying some of the creatures that live on the seashore. Then, working in small groups, Beavers spend up to 20 minutes picking up litter along the beach (gloves provided). They discover the length of time it takes different items to degrade and we consider the problems litter causes for wildlife and people. We end the session with beach art, using small trowels and natural resources found on the shore, to create art work on the beach. All equipment provided. Wellies essential!

Woodland Visit

For this session we explore Crow Wood, a small area of mixed woodland at The Moors National Park Centre at Danby. The Beavers play a series of games and use their senses to explore this woodland habitat. This is followed up with shelter building using natural materials. All equipment provided.

Duration: about 3 hours

Cost: Short day rate £5.50 per child
Minimum per group £82.50
