



North York Moors National Park Education Service Activities for Uniformed Groups

Beavers: My Adventure Challenge Award

This visit can achieve some of the requirements for this award:

- Take part in six outside activities, e.g. following a trail, building a den, building a sculpture using sand, snow or mud. (Any activity which is based on being outside counts for this element.)
- Go on a ramble or nature walk with a purpose, e.g. a treasure hunt.



At the end of the session each Beaver is presented with a certificate of merit.

Choose any 3 of these outdoor activities:

Moorland walk (1½ hours): This is a 2 ½ km walk through some of the habitats and beautiful scenery of the National Park. Beavers follow a simple map and explore the landscape through games and activities along the way.

Den building (1 hour): Beavers explore Crow Wood near the Visitor Centre and work together in groups to build a den big enough to house their pack leader!

Sculpture using natural materials (1 hour): Beavers follow a sculpture trail in the grounds of the visitor centre to discover statues, leaping salmon and a dragon! They finish with a woodland sculpture activity, making transient art from natural materials.

Treasure Hunt (1 hour): A nature walk with a purpose - Beavers explore the grounds of The Moors Centre to locate missing clues which reveal some of the wildlife of the North York Moors and point the way to hidden treasure!

Duration: up to 3½ hours plus a lunch break

Cost: Short day rate £5.50 per child
Minimum per group £82.50
